Building a Better Me

“Building a Better Me” is a new Blue Cap initiative, where we assist individuals in becoming advocates for their personal health. This program is up-and-running and Mark has made a mad dash to the gym. Mark expressed interest in building muscles and becoming stronger. He joined Quads gym in Calumet City and has been building muscles and his confidence with each trip to the gym.

With Mark’s independent nature he did not want any assistance in the gym. During his first few visits he observed the other patrons routine and mimicked the movements in order to complete his workout. To ensure his safety and to further assist him with his goals, Mark was given a personal trainer. His personal trainer Kelvin Freeman is doing a phenomenal job with him. Overcoming the obstacle of training a deaf individual, Mr. Freeman purchased an ASL book to learn how to communicate with his client. During his time with Mark he has learned several words and phrases and has built a great rapport with Mark. When asked about his interactions with Mark, he stated “I enjoy training him, unlike some people who pay money and really don’t want to come to the gym, he really wants to be here. He always comes in and he’s ready to work. Others can learn a lot from his work ethics.”

Not only is Mark an inspiration to other individuals with disabilities to lead a healthy lifestyle, he is also an inspiration to his trainer who is slowly learning ASL and has expressed interest in working with other adults with developmental disabilities. Mark shows us that having a disability does not stop you from building a better you.

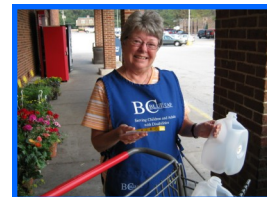
In order to make this event a success, we are currently seek-

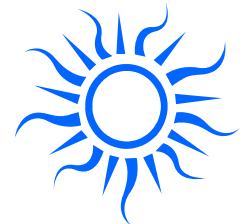
